Anti-Bullying Policy - one page summary - 2024-2025

All staff at Parson Street Primary School actively encourage the 3 Simple Rules - **Ready**, **Respectful** and **Safe**. Some behaviours which are not respectful to others, or keeping them safe might be defined as bullying behaviours. We define bullying as: being mean to someone repeatedly.

- Bullying often includes: teasing, talking about hurting someone, spreading rumours, leaving someone out on purpose, attacking someone by hitting them or yelling at them.
- Bullying does not always happen in person.
- Bullying can be, but not limited to: emotional, physical, racist, sexual, homo/transphobic, verbal or cyber (online).

How we respond to bullying

- Staff will report bullying incidents to the Senior Leadership Team. Parents who are concerned that their child is being bullied should inform their child's class teacher or a Designated Safeguarding Lead without delay.
- 2. Staff will record the incident(s) electronically.
- 3. Ensure safety or all children involved. Consider increased supervision or keeping children separate until the incident has been investigated.
- 4. Investigate the allegations and interview all involved, including witnesses.
- 5. If appropriate, discussion with parents of either or both children involved
- 6. SLT write an action plan with a clear review date and share with all relevant staff. Actions on this plan may include
 - social interventions,
 - referral to external agencies,
 - daily check ins,
 - behaviour plans,
 - key stage and/or whole school assemblies,
 - Anti-Bullying week activities
 - staff training including playground staff,
 - train staff to identify the difference between relational conflict and bullying,
 - if bullying is online this may include requesting that content be removed
 - 7. If necessary, write a Risk Assessment for either / all of the children involved
 - 8. All Action Plans will be regularly reviewed as part of our Termly Monitoring cycle to

ensure actions are effective and any bullying behaviour has ceased.
